District Essay Contest Submitted by Patty Clark, District Chair

The District Judging Deadlines for the Clubs to submit their essays to the District Chair, Patty Clark, is FEBRUARY 28, 2014. District entries are judged and submitted to the Optimist International Programs Department no later than April 15, 2014.

Keeping that in mind, the Club level should have all their entries judged and to Patty by February 28th. The Topic this year is "How Dreams Lead to Success". They must be 700-800 words (title, footnotes and bibliography are not included in the final work count). Hyphenated words count as one (1) word. The age eligibility is open to students under age 19 who have not yet graduated from high school or the equivalent, regardless of when the Club, Zone, or District Contest is held. Prizes are given on the district level of \$2,500 college scholarship for the first place winner. Club Level is usually medallion (ordered through the Optimist Supply of US). Clubs are allowed to give monetary awards of up to \$500 per winner for the Essay contest in addition to the official medallion. The Club level awards may be given in the form of a scholarship, savings bond or cash prize but are completely discretionary. You can find more information on the website of www.Optimist.org. The entire package has more information which includes applications forms and official rules.

Childhood Cancer


